IGFP responds to the migration crisis during COVID-19

The Corona pandemic has severely impacted millions of mostly informal migrant workers in India. This crisis has made visible the precarious work situation of internal migrants with limited or no access to social security, occupational safety and health.

Since the beginning of the pandemic, IGFP has taken up the plight of the internal migrant workers and responded with a series of activities:

- ❑ First online panel discussion on challenges and solutions of migrant workers during the Corona pandemic (15 May)
- ❑ Formulation of a standard operating procedure for migrant workers during crisis situations as a result of the panel discussion on 15 May, which was sent as a recommendation to Central and State Governments
- ❑ Talk on migrant construction workers and handing-over of relief material and personal protective equipment to distressed migrant workers (7 July)
- ❑ Second online panel discussion on challenges and solutions of migrant workers during the Corona pandemic (13 July)

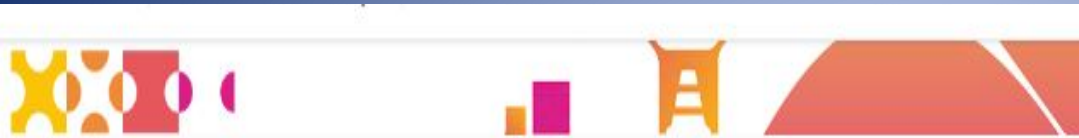

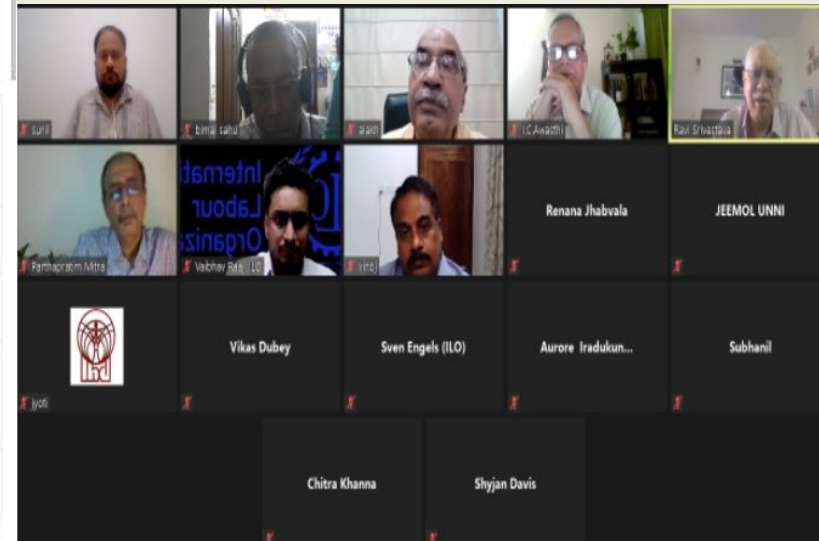

Disaster Management will be taught as compulsory subject in colleges in Odisha

BHUBANESWAR: A course on disaster management will be taught as a compulsory subject during the first year at colleges in Odisha, the state's Higher Education minister Arun Sahoo said.

The move comes after the Odisha government had decided on May 29 to include disaster and pandemic management in high school and college curricula.

"Odisha State Higher Education Council has prepared a new course Environmental Studies and Disaster Management for +3 (Plus III) 1st year arts, science and commerce students from this year as (a) compulsory subject," the higher education minister tweeted on Friday.

Sahoo said the course was prepared in accordance with the cabinet decision on May 29 and direction of Chief Minister Naveen Patnaik.

The cabinet had said everyone in the state should be well prepared to face the challenges posed by disasters, such as frequent cyclones and also the coronavirus pandemic.

Cyclone Yaas had left a trail of devastation in the state on May 26, bringing heavy rain, damaging houses, destroying farmlands and disrupting the electrical network.

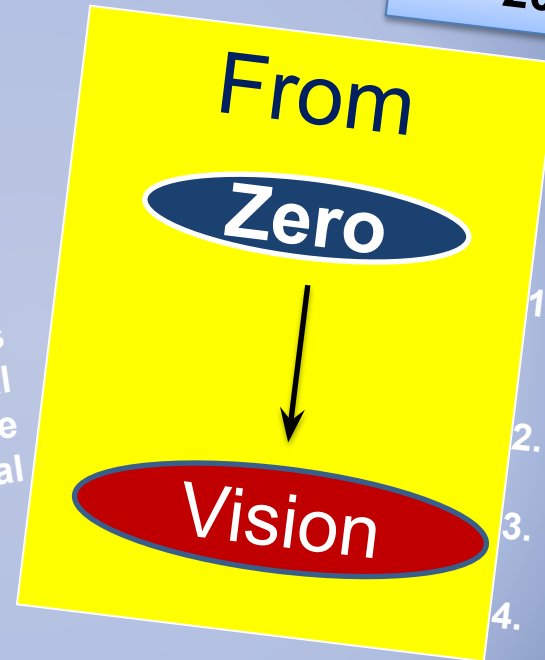
